

Med-Lock stickers are being introduced into our care environments to help bedside clinicians identify when a central line is "locked" with a medication such as heparin or trisodium citrate. This prevents accidental injection of medications into the bloodstream by properly identifying hubs that have medication instilled in them prior to flushing the line for use.

			To place sticker: Remove adhesive cover from the back of sticker (Tab 1 and Tab 2)			
			The back center of the sticker should still have adhesive cover on it so no adhesive is placed on the tubing. Place the tubing in this spot. Stick Tab 1 and Tab 2 together with the orange med-lock facing out. Med-Lock sticker should be applied to individual hub TUBING. Remember <u>one</u> sticker for <u>each</u> port.			
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			Do NOT place sticker directly on the port or on the central line dressing.
